## **Completing the Name Change Petition**

Arkansas Legal Services Partnership Family Law Series

This fact sheet provides an example of a Name Change petition and instructions to complete the petition. A petition is a formal request to the court to take an action. In this case, your petition will ask the court for a name change either for you or your minor child.

The petition should be on 8 1/2 x 11 size paper with 1" margins. **Judges prefer petitions to be typed**. If it is not possible to type the document then the judge must be able to read your handwriting.

## INSTRUCTIONS TO COMPLETE A PETITION

Enter in the name of the county that you live in and the division of the court that you are filing the petition in. The Circuit Clerk will assign the division and case number.

- In the blank beside IN RE enter your name as it is today. It doesn't matter here what you want your name to be, it is important that you enter your full name as it is right now.
- You are the petitioner; so enter your name in the space provided following the word **petitioner**.
- In paragraph 1, enter in the name of the county that you live in. For example, if you live in Clinton, Arkansas, you would put Van Buren County.
- In paragraph 2, enter the reason that you want to change your name. This should be complete and understandable. For example, if you are now divorced and you want to return to your maiden name, but didn't do so in your divorce proceedings, then state this as the reason for your name change. Just remember that your stated reason will be the primary factor the judge considers in determining whether or not to grant your petition.
- Also in paragraph 2 enter the new name that you are requesting. CHECK YOUR SPELLING. If you misspell the new name, so will the judge and you will have go back to court to get it corrected.

In the final paragraph, after the word WHEREFORE, enter, in full, the name that you currently have in the first space and the full name that you want to be known by in the second space. Again, CHECK YOUR SPELLING.

Then, take the petition to a notary public and sign it in front of that notary. Get the notary to notarize the petition and give it back to you. This will probably cost you around \$10.00.

Take the petition and three (3) copies to the court clerk in the county in which you live and file it with the court. You will need a cover sheet for Circuit Court that you can get either from the Clerk, or from the court forms section at <a href="https://www.courts.state.ar.us">www.courts.state.ar.us</a>. The filing fee will be \$140. If service is needed the fee will vary. Keep a copy of the petition for your personal records.

Once the judge rules on the petition he or she will issue an order of name change. You must provide this document. See an example order below. Check it closely when you get it for spelling errors and let the clerk know of any that you find. Complete the order by using the same instructions you used with the petition.

After filing the petition the clerk can then tell you when the hearing will be. The clerk can also tell you what that particular court's actions are on name change petitions, and when and how you should get the Order. Be nice to the clerks, they can help you understand the system, but they don't have to.
