The Center for Arkansas Legal Services and Legal Aid of Arkansas are nonprofit organizations that provide free legal help to low-income Arkansans.

Do you help in my area?

Yes. We serve all counties in Arkansas. Use the contact information on this fact sheet to apply for free legal aid.

What types of cases do you handle?

We provide free civil legal services (non-criminal cases). There are many types of civil cases we handle. Some examples are:

- **Family law** (such as adoptions, custody, visitation, guardianships, and other issues)
- **Elder law** (such as garnish of social security, housing issues, and other issues)
- **Consumer/Debt** (such as bankruptcies, debt collection defense, and other issues)
- **Public Benefits** (such as SSI appeals)
- **Housing law** (such as landlord-tenant, public housing cases, foreclosures, and other issues)
- **Other non-criminal issues**

Are there income limits?
