UALR has student representatives available to help with the possible resolution of your tax controversies.

What does the UALR Tax Clinic Do?

- ❑ They offer completely free tax counseling and representation before the IRS.
- ❑ They offer educational programs to inform individuals for whom English is a second language of their taxpayer rights and responsibilities.

Who does the UALR Tax Clinic Help?

- ❑ Low-Income Taxpayers; and
- ❑ People for who English is a Second Language.

The UALR Low-Income Tax Clinic can assist you in the following areas and more:

- ❑ IRS Audits or Examinations;
- ❑ Earned Income Tax Credit Appeals;
- ❑ IRS Appeals;
- ❑ Negotiations and/or Settlements of Tax Debt with IRS;
- ❑ Innocents Spouse Relief;
- ❑ Collection issues with the IRS; and
- ❑ Offers in Compromise.

The UALR Low-Income Tax Clinic can also:

- ❑ Inform you of your federal tax rights and responsibilities;
- ❑ Assist you in tax controversies, audit and collection matters related to the IRS; and
- ❑ Assist you in claiming money you may be owed by the IRS.
